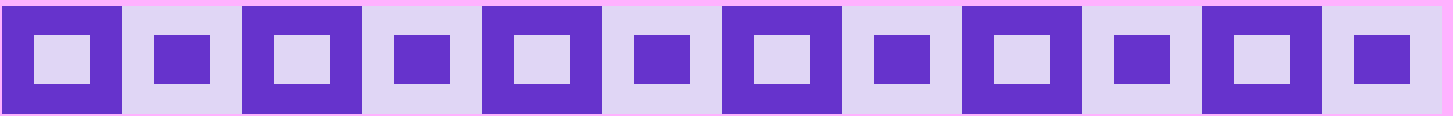


Kind Words From Our Neighbors
